<u>Useful</u> <u>Information</u>.

Skillywadden Barn is not on the main sewer.

All waste water is processed on site, in a system of tanks under the drive, and once cleaned it is returned to the nearby stream. Visitors are requested to flush toilet paper only into the toilets, not thicker items such as make up removal tissues, tampons etc. as they damage the system.

Eco – friendly cleaning materials, washing up liquid and other necessaries are provided for visitors use.

How to find Skillywadden Barn

From A30 and the North: Follow the A30 until you reach the island where you take the right turn for St Ives on the A3074. This takes about two hours from the M5 at Exeter. Take the next turning on the left marked for Lelant Downs. At Lelant Downs bear right and follow the road (about three miles) until you come to the T junction with the B3311. Turn left here and then almost immediately right off the B3311 onto a narrow lane. This is signposted to Towednack. Follow this road. It curves quite a lot.

Ignore the sign to Penderleath on your left, and take the right fork (about 200yds) and follow this road to Cold Harbour (about one mile). At Cold Harbour the lane swings round to the right. Follow this, ignoring the left fork marked for Penzance and take the first left turn (about 200 yards) for Skillywadden. This is signposted for Amalveor, Georgia and Embla. We are about 800 yards down the lane on the sharp right hand bend just after the small bridge with metal railings painted green. Skillywadden

is on the left just after the bend. It has two sets of wooden gates.

If you miss this turning, the next building you see on the left is an old school house which is being done up, then a signpost for Towednack Church. You need to turn back, or you will end up on the road to St. Ives.

From St. Ives: Take the coast road signposted for Zennor and St. Just. Follow this past Rosewall Hill on your left, around some steep curves, then take a small turning on the left signposted for Towednack. Stay on this lane until you see a right turn, just after the Church, for Amalveor, Georgia and Embla. Take this turning, and follow the lane over the little bridge to Skillywadden.

Nearby places of Interest include St. Ives with its harbour, beaches, restaurants and galleries, including Tate St. Ives; Zennor; Cape Cornwall; Lands' End; Penzance, Mousehole with its historic harbour and village; St. Michael's Mount; and a little further afield, Padstow; Newquay; Falmouth; The Eden Project near St. Austell and the Lost Gardens of Heligan near Mevagissey.

Skillywadden Barn is approximately 200 years old, and has been converted to provide modern accommodation for up to 4 people. It is situated in ideal touring and walking country, on the Tinnners Way, a footpath that runs from St. Just to St. Ives, and close to the South West Coast Path.



The accommodation comprises an entrance hall from enclosed garden, 1 twin and one double bedroom, each with its own en- suite toilet and shower on the ground floor, and living accommodation on the first floor.

In addition to central heating radiators. The dining kitchen is fully equipped with double oven electric cooker, microwave, slimline larder fridge and separate freezer, dishwasher and washing machine. It has French doors opening to a small balcony.



Bed linen, towels and essentials such as washing up liquid, dishwasher tablets, toilet rolls and tea towels are supplied.

There is a flat screen television, DVD player, radio/CD player in the sitting room.
